Skills and Objectives

To develop skills introduced at Level 1 and Level 2 and to prepare students effectively for research and independent study skills and methods necessary at university level study.

The emphasis therefore is on research processes and in developing evaluation skills, and appropriate communication methods, oral and written. At this level particularly, the study of historiography, significance and analysis are examined.

ASSESSMENT

Three external examinations and three internal assessments which will be moderated. There will be 31 credits available.

WHERE DOES IT LEAD?

The study of history at this level can lead to tertiary studies, using the subject as a major or minor degree component. Career aspects include law, journalism, teaching, commerce/business, public relations, police, armed forces, advertising, library work, tourism. Government Departments, publishing, broadcasting, Foreign Affairs, Social Work, as well as specific fields such as those of archaeology, museum officer, archivist or research officer.
