ABOUT THE HUBBARD CHURCHER SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Hubbard Churcher Scholarship began in 2004 when Alan and Margaret Hubbard established the Hubbard Churcher Scholarship Trust Fund. This scholarship was established to assist secondary school students in South Canterbury who wished to proceed to university or tertiary education but due to financial or social disadvantage were not able to do so.

The Hubbard Churcher Scholarship Fund has assisted more than 60 local students to further their education since it was first given out in 2005. Aoraki Foundation took over the management of this fund in 2023.

ABOUT THE AORAKI FOUNDATION

The Aoraki Foundation is a registered Charitable Trust, established in 2009. The Foundation provides a trusted, effective, and simple way for individuals, families, clubs, and organisations to give long-lasting benefits to charitable causes within the South Canterbury Region.

Every gift the Aoraki Foundation receives is from the generosity of those who have the South Canterbury region at heart. Donations are made either as a one-off, a regular payment through payroll giving, or from a gift in a will. Donations the Foundation receives are invested, and the income generated from the investment is distributed to worthy, local causes that honour the wishes of the donor.

ELIGIBILITY FOR A HUBBARD CHURCHER SCHOLARSHIP

To be eligible for a Hubbard Churcher Scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

Reside and attending a secondary school within the South Canterbury area. This includes
Waimate & Mackenzie
Are a NZ citizen or hold permanent NZ residency.
Have been recommended by your school principal or their nominee.

Scholarships are open for young people with a financial or social disadvantage. There is no need to prove a financial or social disadvantage, we take the recommendation from your school as confirmation you meet this criteria.

IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER

- The closing date for scholarship applications is Friday 13 September 2024.
- Applicants will be notified of the outcome of their application by Mid-November 2024.
- Recipients shall complete a written report to the Aoraki Foundation within 12 months of receipt of funds, outlining the use of funds for their particular area of pursuit.

VALUE AND PAYMENT OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

The Hubbard Churcher Scholarship Fund awards scholarships annually and predominantly have a value of up to \$2,500 per year for a maximum of three years. The scholarship is to contribute towards activities in the pursuit of further education at a University or another Tertiary Institution.

If the application is successful, payment will be made directly to the course provider upon booking a course or to accommodation costs such as a halls of residence.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- All applications received prior to the closing date will be reviewed.
- Applicants who are shortlisted through this initial review process may be required to attend an interview before representatives of the Aoraki Foundation.
- A scholarship may be revoked if a recipient's behavior is deemed to be inappropriate to bring themselves or The Aoraki Foundation into disrepute (e.g., inappropriate behaviour on social media, criminal activity), or the recipient has breached conditions of the scholarship.
- It is expected that the funds distributed will be used within 12 months of receipt of funds. The board may at its discretion fund each scholarship for a further two years subject to the same criteria.
- Recipients shall be responsible for providing any gear and equipment required for the pursuit that is not supplied by a course provider or covered by any scholarship awarded.
- Details of the higher education being undertaken must be provided upon application.
- Successful applicants must provide confirmation of acceptance into the course and a student number.
- Applications are considered once a year.
- It is the applicants' responsibility to ensure that they are eligible for their chosen pursuit and have no health or personal issues that may prevent them from undertaking this.
- The Aoraki Foundation trustees may cancel any scholarship or suspend payment or claim a refund in respect of payments already made for breach of these regulations or other sufficient cause.
- Recipients may be asked by the Foundation to participate in promotional activities as agreed by both parties.
- Immediate family of trustees and staff of the Aoraki Foundation are not eligible to apply for these scholarships.
